# **Video Use in Curriculum Policy**

#### **Curriculum Use of Videos**

When selecting and using non-print texts:-

- 1. All legal and duty of care responsibilities must be undertaken.
- 2. It is essential that the curriculum purpose is clearly established.
- 3. This applies equally to film and television classifications.

# **Duty of Care**

Receiving permission to use a video, does not absolve teachers from their responsibility to make a judgement about the appropriateness of the video.

**Parental Permission:** Teachers should provide a short statement about the video and its place in the teaching and learning program.

Parents and guardians have the right to withdraw their children from viewing, and such decision must be respected and catered for with an educational program. **School Responsibilities:** Teachers cannot make decisions on behalf of parents or guardians where students are under the recommended age or where there is any doubt as to the suitability of the video.

## **Copyright and Video Hire**

Teachers must ensure that the video shown and the conditions under which it is shown comply with the copyright laws.

Teachers must advise the video store that the video being hired is to be viewed in a classroom for educational purposes.

Making video tapes of television transmission is permitted, provided the tapes are marked appropriately and they are made for educational purposes.
