## MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

**Dear Parents and Carers** 

#### **Strings Night**

What an amazing evening of music we were treated to on Thursday evening last week. Our annual Strings Night was a celebration of the talents and efforts of SIM (School of Instrumental Music) students and choir members. The harmonies of the girls' choir and the theatrics of the boys' choir delighted us all ... and then there were the performances of those who learn, guitar, violin, cello and double bass through the Department of Education's SIM program; a program that celebrated 50 years of instrumental music education in a concert at Perth Concert Hall last night. The Department's instrumental music program commenced in 1968 with 700 students, and now caters for 19 000 children across the state. Mrs Preston and I were last week reminiscing about our early days as instrumental music students, when we had classes of ten ... learning the trumpet! Although we attended different primary schools, we shared the same music teacher, Mr John Wood. I'm often reminded that in both education and music, Perth is quite a connected city. My congratulations to all our students who performed at on Strings Night, and thank you to teachers; Ms Sarina Li, Mrs Wendy Tusak, Ms Therese Arnold (violin and orchestra), Ms Alex Bak (cello), Ms Anna Person (double bass) and Mr Steven Sutherland (guitar).

You will also find out about the National Allergy Strategy food allergy prevention project.


